Cycles

The rhythms of God are cyclic; His fingerprints are all over creation. So why do we constantly measure life in lineal terms?

The world spins around the sun, we call that a year.

The moon spins around the earth, we call that a month.

The world itself spins and as it does we call that a day.

All renewing in their own time, but we measure them lineally.

The tilted axis of our world creates 4 seasons in a year, Spring, Summer, Autumn and Winter, but which season comes first? Remember, the calendar is our creation not God's and the calendar is a lineal measurement within a year.

Adults give way to young in an ever cyclic renewing of life, animals and plants, fish and coral. Even the tectonic nature of our world is ever renewing our planet's surface. A woman's birthing cycle creates rhythms in our homes, and yet we always want to measure things lineally. We, as human beings, love measuring and celebrating the cycles of our world. This lineal measuring creates for us a sense of longevity and entitlement while at others, loss.

In the case of measuring trips around the Sun, several of our churches are holding, or have held, significant birthdays this year. Marion, 40 trips around the Sun, Hewett Community formerly Gawler, Strathalbyn, 150 rotations to name a few. Many other churches have celebrated similar milestones in their time. Some have never moved locations; some haven't stopped moving locations. In the case of Gawler and the Strathalbyn Churches, there are no founding members alive. The members of the church have cycled through, which is why we focus on celebrations, the longevity and the loss. When I look at the Churches of Christ Bicentennial Book there are many churches named there that no longer exist. In some cases, the town or suburb has been engulfed and renamed. There are some Surnames recorded there that, today, continue the legacies within a church or our movement. We celebrate those people who have recently joined our family and carry our name, Churches of Christ. Even the Bicentennial Book itself is a legacy of times gone by and yet despite the closures, amalgamations and new Church plants occur to secure and renew our Churches of Christ

in SA (and NT). While we may not be active in the NT at the moment, we can be again someday when the Lord deems it so or we have the motivation and personnel to do so.

Recently, David Whyatt, our historian and archivist, shared with me our archived reports from our 1948, 1959, 1980, 1983, 1984-5, 1987 and 1990 reviews. Each of these reports cover the same topics, "Review". And the wheel keeps turning even today. Strategy plan after strategy plan. From our 1990 review:

- Improve the image of the Board and promoting the work of Conference.
- Providing a definitive, positive direction for churches around the idea of 'Equipping Churches of Christ for effective Mission'.
- Sharing resources and skills among the churches.
- Direct interaction with ministers and church boards

Sound familiar?

When you're not a centrally governed Denomination run by the clergy, (and Churches of Christ fall into the 'not' category), it's hard to keep continuity throughout the years as we appoint and renew the leadership of our churches.

After reflecting on the cyclic nature of our reviews, I have chosen to celebrate this cycle of renewal rather than wrestling with the need for yet another one, or the energy they take. These cyclic rhythms of review and renewal enable re-assessment and enable reengagement of the requirements of being an association of churches. Each Church, as members of the organisation, participating as Churches of Christ in SA and NT Inc. Together, exploring the effectiveness of our commitment to each other and our missional expressions and structural relationships. And, in answer to just such a question, State Board has received gracious donations over and above \$76,000 by our churches supporting the State Board budget.

As I reviewed these historic documents, the youngest of which is 30 years old, the one component that is missing is a review of each Member church and their participation in the movement.

Why do we as a movement come back again and again to these 4 things? I believe it's because:

We know they are the core items of our association.

We know they are the requirement of healthy community.

After two years in this role and in the understanding that we as a movement are inter-dependent churches who are self-governed, let me ask of each church leadership, each minister and each member of each church; How are our member Churches:

- Upholding Conference's image and work?
- Equipping with definitive, positive direction their participation in the Movement's Effective Mission? (see Conference hand book)
- Sharing resources and skills among each other and with State Board?
- Engaging with State Office Personnel as Ministers and Church Boards.

Yes, there is much to be done. Rather than fight against it, I choose to engage it and celebrate our intentional efforts of reflection, refreshment and renewal. These cyclic reviews have about them the fingerprint of God. They have about them the Holy Spirit's correction when we have strained our relationships. They have about them the death and resurrection cycle.

May we, as a movement, always return to collectively being about the Good News who is Christ Jesus and the coming of the Kingdom of God. To be aware of its ways of breaking into our world afresh each day through Christ's body, the Church, and the breaking of bread with each other.

I have no doubt that even when we finish the current renewal process around the year 2030, we will be ready to come back to re-exploring the Conference or whatever we call it then, because we and the world will have changed, the leadership will have changed, the ministers will have changed. We need to attend to the foundational work of unity.

So in the shadow of things that have been, that are and that will be again, I share with you the age-old blessing of Numbers 6: 24-26 in the midst of God's cyclic revelation.

"The Lord bless you and keep you;
The Lord make His face shine upon you,
And be gracious to you;
The Lord lift up his countenance upon you,
And give you peace."
