

GR Stirling Lecture 2016

The GR Stirling Lecture has been held annually since 1996 with the purpose of stimulating conversation about the identity and mission of the movement known as 'Churches of Christ'. This year's GR Stirling Lecturer is Dr Merryl Blair, Senior Lecturer in Old Testament at the Stirling Theological College in Melbourne. The title for Merryl's lecture is:

"Christians formed and transformed around the Lord's Table"

Coming together in communion at the Lord's Table has long been recognised as the 'central' focus of worship in our movement. We have assumed that this is a distinctive practice that identifies us specifically, among the wider expressions of Christian community. Certainly, our practice of 'open table' demonstrates an understanding of what the Lord's Table means (for example, in terms of 'host' and 'guest') that is very different from the traditions that practice a 'closed table'.

It will probably come as something of a surprise to many to hear that our movement has been involved in an International Dialogue with the Roman Catholic Church for around 30 years. For the past 4 years, this has focused on our joint, and different, understandings of coming around the table of the Lord. Ecumenical Dialogues are an important forum in which we not only learn more about other traditions, but also learn much, much more about ourselves, because we have to explain to someone outside our 'family' just who we are, and why we do the things we do. So much that we take for granted comes to life during this process.

Australian Merryl Blair has been the representative on this Dialogue for the past 9 years. She has learnt not only about who we are, and who Catholics are, throughout this

experience; perhaps more importantly, she has learnt the joy of sitting in the same room with people of different views; listening and being listened to respectfully; sharing experiences of God at work in the life of God's church: and what it means to be formed by the Lord's Table.



Merryl will share some of this process of Dialogue with you in the Stirling Lecture. She will also share with you what she has learnt, from participation in the Dialogue, about being a community who is formed and transformed at the Lord's Table: being formed in faith in God's ability to provide nourishment; being formed to live through suffering and death, into a life of resurrection; being transformed as a people who must continually be open to God's future; and being sent from the Table to be the people of God in the world.

Selfie Sunday: Be Part of the Big Picture

Selfie Sunday is nearly upon us... so it's time to respond to your Frequently Asked Questions:

What's Selfie Sunday again?

A day to take a snapshot your church community. Read the documents on the <u>Selfie Sunday website</u> to learn more.

What is the date of Selfie Sunday? The postcard doesn't say.

A recommended date is the 16th of October. However, you can use any Sunday in October that suits your church.

Is Selfie Sunday just for small churches? How do we take a photo of a lot of people?

Selfie Sunday is for churches of all sizes; a snapshot in time of the hugely diverse Churches of Christ family. Large churches might chose to take a photo the big sea of faces, or take photos of different segments of the church so that the faces are more recognisable. If you need to submit more than 10 photos, email contact@selfiesunday.org

Why are you asking for information about our church?

So we can get to know and learn from our wider church family.

Selfie Sunday is also a snapshot in time for future historians, in the same way the <u>Jubilee History</u> tells us about the early days of Churches of Christ in Australia.

How do we submit photos and information?

Find the UPLOAD tab on the Selfie Sunday website. This will generate a profile for your church. If you have difficulty using this, you can email contact@selfiesunday.org

What do we do if we can't answer all of the questions?

Just do what you can! Don't miss out on your church being Part of the Big Picture.

What about privacy issues?

You will need to let your congregation(s) know their photo will be used on the Selfie Sunday website, and allow anyone to leave who doesn't consent to this. Checkout the website for more information and forms.

Why is there an option to include names of people in the photo?

Selfie Sunday is a community building exercise. One of the fun things you will be able to do on the fully-formed site is search for the names of people you met on a camp in 1963, or who attended the same youth group in 1975, or who you met at State Youth Games in 1999 (etc).

Selfie Sunday will also create a historical resource for your children's children's children (etc). The information for Selfie Sunday will be stored forever! It will be interesting to trace Churches of Christ families over time.

If it is difficult to record everyone's names, (especially for large churches) a named photo of the church leadership team will be a helpful inclusion.
