Our State review continues and your participation in it is vital to our movement's future. For your information, both NSW and Vic/Tas Conferences have been through similar reviews in the last decade. At present it seems it's our turn, so too the National Council, which will also need your prayers to engage what it needs to do to 'reset' its priorities and agendas.

Thank you for the opportunity to work with you on our review. I look forward with Faith, Hope and Love for all that God is doing and will do within us to further His Kingdom.

Report to Members on Conference Review

Review update

At our Convention many people were asking Derek Lindsell "What's next for the State Conference Review?" In recognition that Derek answered many of your questions by saying "that's up to you", as your appointed person ensuring the review continues, I want to invite you into the process of our journey while not preempting any outcomes (as Derek was keen not to do).

Historically

- a. In 2016 the State Board initiated a review of Churches of Christ in SA and NT with Derek Lindsell of Apricot Consultancy.
- b. A Review Team was created to oversee and implement a State Wide Review intending to:
 - i. engage the members of our churches in order to seek vision for the future,
 - ii. address the financial viability of the Conference of Churches of Christ.
- c. In 2017 the Review Team (with Derek) held 6 regional review meetings
- d. Out of those meetings, a preliminary definition of the term "conference" was formed (for the purpose of the review having a common theme) and three groups were created in order to support the appropriate progress of this State Conference Review:
 - i. Guiding Coalition created to hear each church's perspectives/visions and relational desires.
 - Financial Sustainability Team created to explore how we best utilise our current resources and explore further opportunities to support our future finances.
 - iii. Prayer Group called into being to support this process prayerfully and seek God's leadership and guidance during this period of review.

Presently

- a. The Guiding Coalition have been visiting churches and gathering feedback to be analysed and collated.
- b. The Financial Sustainability Team are continuing to meet.
- c. Prayer Group members are praying (please join them in your prayers for this process and Godly outcomes).

Where to from here

- The Review Team will receive the feedback from the churches and delegate 5-6 people to independently consolidate these your responses.
- ii. Your responses will then be collated and shared with: a. the State Board
 - b.you, the members of the churches that make up Churches of Christ in SA
- iii. We will enter into a time of
 - a. Prayerful consideration of this input

- b. Assessing responses to the findings
 c.Exploration of implementations of the desired outcomes
- iv. At the same time the Financial Sustainability Team will be submitting their preliminary reports to the State Board.

To date there have been twenty-three visits to churches while others have been arranged or are being arranged. With 19 churches still to visit, the State Board and Review Team are keen to not let the process drag on too long.

We know that some of those 19 churches yet to be visited, are ready and willing to participate in the review. To that end, the new approach for 2018 is that I will contact each of our remaining churches seeking their nomination of an appropriate time for their membership to gather and respond to the review. The Review Team are committed to having someone from the Guiding Coalition available to facilitate this conversation, note responses and answer any questions which church members may have about the review.

The Review Team has also set the date of 29th March for the conclusion of these church consultation visits by the Guiding Coalition members for the review.

Let me remind you that these meetings are designed for our churches to share with each other through the review, their dreams and hopes for the future of our Churches of Christ in South Australia.

The key to these discussions and our future explorations as a Conference of churches is the definition agreed to in the May 2017 meeting. That definition was

"Conference is the intentional relationships between churches under the banner of Churches of Christ, committed to each other and the gospel, with God working through us for the benefit of God's Kingdom."

As the State Conference Review continues, I invite you to consider how you might respond to this definition of who we seek to be, both individually and as a church.

Prayer as always remains our strongest tool for the road ahead. Our Prayer Partners are a valued part of the review process. Through praying we hold each other in Love and ensure God's will be done.

Please continue to pray for our churches, for the Guiding Coalition members, Scott, and the review process. Please feel free to contact me or Doug Walladge (as ongoing chairperson of the Review Team), if you would like further information or you would like to offer a comment.


