

A Christmas Message

The hope for many at this time of year is to celebrate with our family and friends. Moving from a time of hustle and bustle to relaxation and rest. Our challenge, at the moment, is that we are entering into a time of change in how the South Australian community is managing the COVID19 pandemic. Uncertainty and anxiety have risen considerably in the last fortnight.

On top of two years of heightened anxiety and uncertainty, many are left feeling the full weight of accumulating fatigue and tiredness. I wonder whether you find yourself in a place of fatigue and tiredness right now? Or do you sit more as an observer within your community of the strains and stressors that are present?

Within the Christian community many celebrate Advent at this time of year. Advent means "arrival" and is a month of preparation for the arrival of Jesus. God amongst us. This practice is not a disconnection from the world around us, but more a preparation to be ready for the what the world brings us.

In Isaiah 26 the prophetic writer talks about "perfect peace" (v3 - Shalom, Shalom in the Hebrew). It is the

idea of God the creator offering a place of calm, joy and hope for those who enter into his kingdom. It is a poem of future home. The arrival of Jesus fulfils this hope, reminding us as Christians that God is amongst us and invites us to enter into his rest.

The prophetic writer in Isaiah does not limit his vision of peace to being an internal presence for the individual. The writer understands the presence of God as an offer of peace to the whole community of greatest benefit to those with little peace such as the poor or the refugee.

The arrival of God amongst us is the promise of receiving the Spirit of God to build us together as community. Advent calls us to sharing peace with each other and creating communities of peace. My hope is that, within each of our churches, we will be able to share peace this Christmas and extend peace to the community around us. A balm for our stressed and strained community.
