Dealing Constructively with Conflict in the Church

Responding constructively to conflict in our church communities creates the possibility of transforming potentially destructive situations and events into opportunities for learning and growth in which no-one need necessarily 'lose', and in which the Body of Christ is built up and strengthened, rather than torn down and disempowered.

Paul's letter to the Galatians was written to a Christian community that ran the risk of destroying itself through unresolved conflict. He writes with passion and conviction, confronting those he believes are planting seeds of conflict and division. He reminds his readers that 'in Christ' they have been given freedom – freedom to love their neighbour - and then warns them, "If, however, you bite and devour one another, take care that you are not consumed by one another." [Gal 5:15]



It's not whether or not our churches have conflict that matters; it's whether or not the way we deal with conflict marks us out as followers of Jesus.
